

Early Pregnancy Assessment Clinic ED Patient Information Sheet

The Early Pregnancy Assessment Clinic (EPAC) is an outpatient clinic located in the Women & Babies Outpatient Clinic (4th floor) of the St Catharines Site Hospital (1200 Fourth Ave, St Catharines, Ontario). and provides care to women **by referral** who are in early (less than 12 weeks) pregnancy who are having problems such as pain or bleeding or have been diagnosed with a pregnancy loss, or miscarriage

You will receive your appointment details for your ultrasound and following appointment before you leave The Emergency Department will arrange your ultrasound and EPAC appointment

1 What to Expect?

Prepare to be in the hospital for about 3hrs. This may vary according to your needs. During that time, you will:

- Register for the visit
- Have your ultrasound in the Diagnostic Imaging department
- Be assessed in EPAC by a nurse, then by the Obstetrician/Gynecologist (and possibly a Medical Residents or Student)
 - Have other interventions, like more blood work or medications, depending on your need
 - Receive further information material specific to your case

2 What to bring?

- Your Health Card
- A list of medications you are taking
- A support person
- A book to read or activity for yourself and others in your party while you wait

3 **Preparing for the ultrasound:**

You must attend with a full bladder. Drink 32oz (4 glasses or 1 liter) of water/juice/tea/coffee an hour before your test. If you feel too full a long time before your test, you can partially empty your bladder. Consider that your bladder has to be full by the time of your test.



4 When should I return to the ED or call 911?

Proceed to SCS ED if you have:

- severe pain
- severe bleeding (soaking 2 or more pads an hour for 2-3hrs)
- look unusually pale
- feel like you are going to faint, or if you do faint.

If you feel really unwell, dial 911. Do not drive yourself.

5 Will EPAC become my obstetrician provider?

No, EPAC will perform assessments and management for abnormal presentations (bleeding or pain) in early pregnancy. Once that is done, you will be referred back to you regular provider. If you do not have one, the Obstetrician you see at EPAC will likely follow you for the reminder of the pregnancy in his/her own office.

6 What can I do until my appointment?

Rest. Drink fluids, take any prescribed medications (Tylenol and Advil are both OK in early pregnancy). Do not do any strenuous activity. We recommend that someone come with you to the appointments. Many find these times strenuous and busy with a lot of new information. If things worsen, please seek care of call 911 (see number 4 above)

7 Do I need a Family Doctor?

A Family Doctor is the most integral part of your medical care and its continuity. Always make sure he/she knows what is happening with your health care and arrange regular follow up. If you designate a family doctor during registration, a copy of the results and reports will be forwarded to his/her office. If you do not have a family doctor, please call Health Care Connect Ontario 1-800-445-1822. You can also register online at their website.
